



NEW TRENDS IN HEALTH CARE: AN INTERNATIONAL VIEW I

GENERAL INFORMATION

This course will give you the opportunity to learn new approaches in health care from international recognized experts in different health fields. It will be entirely taught in English. This course is aimed to undergraduate and graduate students in social and health sciences, and any professional interested in this topic.

New Trends in Health Care I (3 ECTS). To complete it, you have to attend 4 seminars.

To obtain a certificate an 80% of attendance is required.

To obtain a certificate + 3 ECTS ("Materia transversal") an 80% of attendance and a critical appraisal of one of the seminars will be required.

Duration: 30 hours (3 ECTS)

This course has limited places that will be allocated on a first-come first-served basis, so early registration is recommended.
